

# The great outdoors

Pool, clubhouse and shared green space enjoyed by residents

he land on which Broken Hill, a 237acre subdivision in the city of Pewaukee, is located has long held a spell on the Siepmann family.

Jim Siepmann, president of Waukesha-based Siepmann Realty Corp., said his father, Ron, often purchased fresh eggs from Ralph Swan, who once owned the former farm property. He got to know Swan — convinced of the land's residential potential. Swan eventually sold the property to another man, a member of the Siepmanns' church, who, in turn, sold it to Siepmann in 1990.

"At that time, there was no sanitary sewer or water, so it was a strategic buy for us," Jim Siepmann said.

With those services in place, however, the real estate firm got to work on his father's vision in 2006.

The subdivision features 113 half-acre lots surrounded by 148 acres of open space, with

By purchasing the property nearly 20 years ago, the Siepmanns were able to get it at a good price and therefore offer larger lots, Siepmann said.

"We could have put at least twice the density in there," he said.

more than a mile of paved walking trails, woods and meadows. Siepmann calls Broken Hill, which served as a featured site in the Metropolitan Builders Association's 2007 Parade of Homes, "incredibly unique."

"It'd be very difficult to do in any other inlying area of metro Milwaukee," he said. "The open space backs up to every single lot and people really enjoy being able to utilize that Mark Henry, owner of Lifestyle Homes of Wisconsin, has a model home for sale within Broken Hill, and is the prospective builder for several lots. Henry said he sees the subdivision's outdoor pool and clubhouse as a major draw.

"It seems to be unique in this area," he said. "You see it more out West or in warmer climates." lot and people really enjoy being able to utilize that green space.

# Energy-smart choices power-up remodels

"The original design wasn't very good," Kiedrowski said. "The rectangular windows pushed out from the bottom and because they are by the driveway. a car would take them out. repairing, it was expensive."

Residences average about 3,000 square feet and largely feature more traditional architecture, including many Colonial- and Victorian-style homes. Broken Hill does require a mixture of styles, Siepmann said, to prevent a stretch of similar looking homes.

#### Location, location, location

The entrance to Broken Hill is located on Swan Road and bordered on the west end by Hwy. 164, Capitol Drive on the south and on the east by Hwy. 74. A variety of merchants, along with fast food and sit-down restaurants are located within one mile of the subdivision.

The city of Pewaukee recently ranked first in BusinessWeek.com's 2009 Best Affordable Suburbs. The publication touted the city's "award-winning schools, low crime, natural beauty and homes for every budget." According to the state's Department of Administration, the city had an estimated population of 12,645 at the end of last year. The village of Pewaukee, which is surrounded by the city, had an estimated population of 8,934 in the same report.

Broken Hill is in the Pewaukee School District, which has nearly 2,250 students and a staff of 290. The district's four schools, two elementary schools and a middle and high school, are all located on the same campus on Lake St.

The subdivision, which still has 48 lots available, has 28 occupied homes and four houses under construction. A timeline for a second phase in the northeast end of Broken Hill has not been established. Lot prices are between \$180,000 and \$220,000.
